SUBJECT: INDIVIDUAL ENTRANCEWAY PLANTING

AMENDED: OCTOBER 2014

PURPOSE: To establish guidelines for co-owners that wish [at their own expense] to add flowers, plants or shrubs to the entranceway of their unit.

POLICY: The Association will maintain the unit entranceways in a clean, neat, safe and sanitary

Condition (this includes grass mowing and trimming shrubs on a routine basis). Co-owners are
encouraged to assist in the maintenance of the shrubs and flowers of their own entranceway.

Co-owners wishing to replace or add flowers, plants or shrubs of their choice to their
own entranceway are encouraged to do so when the following requirements/procedures
are followed.

Exhibit A, Article VI, Section 14 of the Condominium By-laws defines the restrictions for landscaping and planting by co-owners upon the common elements.

## **REQUIREMENTS**

## **SHRUBS**

- 1. To replace or add shrubs or similar plants (excluding flowers see below) to the unit entranceway, prior approval by the Board is required.
- If approved, the cost of the planting will be the sole responsibility of the co-owner. Any ongoing maintenance of the shrubs will be the responsibility of the Association unless the co-owner specifies on the request form that they [co-owner] prefer to perform the maintenance.
- 3. Shrubs are to be planted so that their mature growth does not interfere with routine maintenance or access to outside meters.

## FLOWERS/PLANTS

- 1. To plant flowers or provide a flowerbed does not require pre-approval.
- 2. The co-owner is <u>responsible for all ongoing maintenance</u> including trimming, weeding, watering, etc. Care is to be taken not to increase maintenance requirements of lawn areas when planning for bedding areas.
- 3. If sod is removed to plant a flowerbed. The co-owner is responsible for the costs of replacing sod if the flowerbed is later eliminated.
- 4. Any removal or replacement of plants required for or due to maintenance will be at the expense of the co-owner.
- 5. Vines or climbing plants <u>may not</u> be planted where they can climb onto any surface or gutter of the building.

## **PROCEDURES**

- Request an Application Form from the Management Company. See ARR 3.2a for sample form.
- 2. Complete the form to include type of planting, and sketch of the location.
- 3. Return the form to the Management Company or the Chairperson of the Landscaping Committee at least 2 weeks prior to the requested action [planting] date.
- 4. The Landscaping Committee will review the request for completeness and advise the co-owner of the appropriate action taken. If approved the request will be forwarded to the Board as a matter of record.
