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Building & Grounds

Although it feels like spring has just arrived many of our 2024 projects and annual activities are already underway. BrightView, the snow removal contractor, has put down topsoil and seed to repair the bares areas in the grass caused by plowing. Ed Neis, the sprinkler contractor, has been on site to get the irrigation system turned on to ensure the seed gets properly watered. Ed found 8 damaged sprinkler heads and he will be back here this week to replace them and then the irrigation will begin.

The Exterior Painters started working on Yorktown and building N is almost completed. Building N was the first on the schedule because there was no garage block to repair. Building D will be painted next followed by Building M; but first M will get new shingles. L and C needed repairs to the old garage cinder block which is nearly finished; block work was done at 26 addresses throughout the community and there is only one address yet to be completed.

The timber retaining wall behind building N is showing its age, especially the south end of the wall where there are a lot of deteriorated railroad ties. We have a bid to repair that part of the wall and if the board approves the bid at the April meeting the work will begin very soon. The contractor also gave us an estimate to replace the entire wall using stone or block - yikes! We will be sticking with timber!

In a few weeks we will be walking around with Darlyn Triplett looking for any issues that arose over the winter. We are optimistic that the spring inspection of the property will not uncover too many additional problems. Please do your part ahead of our walk around by getting your flower beds in shape and getting rid of any weeds around your patios and decks.

This last month has been very productive. As you probably observed, our landscaping contractor ACE has been here first, doing Spring cleanup and then spreading Mulch throughout, making our community a much more desirable place to live

The West end of the creek between Washington Circle and Bristol had some very invasive growth that was actually growing into the creek and stopping the flow of the water. We had Blackstone Landscaping come in and remove it. They also cleaned all of the large branches and weeds out of the area.

The next project done by Blackstone Landscaping was clearing all the overgrowth on the South side of our property in back of the condos on Bristol. Now that is cleared out, hopefully if the BOD approves it, we will have Blackstone do some planting along the back of the property.

The creek, East of the bridge has been cleared and cleaned out by Blackstone Landscaping making it much more presentable. There was much undergrowth in the bushes behind the pool and along the bank.

Our snow removal contractor, Brightview finally came to repair the damage that was done over the winter by the snowplows making it easier for the lawn mowing contractor, ACE to do their job.

ACE was here on Wednesday the 17th doing the first mowing of the season. There are some spots where the grass is torn up but that is to be expected due to the wetness of the grounds. This will all even out in the weeks to come.

*The City of Northville has returned our 2023 tree bond money in March - \$1720.

*Our pool phone will be reactivated on May 20. The customer Loyalty Department of ATT reduced our monthly phone charge from \$295 per month to \$110 to keep our business.

*An agreement between the North Condos and LCHA has been approved to share the cost of maintenance of Revere Ct. LCHA owns Revere Ct. but the North Condos share the street. It's only fair for them to help with the maintenance.

*Due to the projected increase in Northville water rates for 2025, we are working with the City to review the assessed billing of LCHA's water meters and hopefully lower the charges.
